## **Terms of Reference**

Project Background	Since the invasion of Ukraine by the Russian Federation began in February 2022, the current crisis in Ukraine has created the greatest refugee surge to EU countries since World War II. To incorporate inclusion and accessibility into humanitarian response plans, in an effort to protect persons with disabilities who risk to be left behind during this unfolding crisis, became an imperative. The European Association of Service providers for Persons with Disabilities (EASPD) became active in supporting the refugees with disabilities coming from Ukraine through its members across Europe. EASPD is a European NGO active in 41 countries representing over 20.000 service providers for persons with disabilities. Its objective is to promote equal opportunities for people with disabilities through effective and high-quality service systems, in line with the principles of the UN Convention on the Rights of Persons with Disabilities. To respond to the challenges faced by young children with disabilities, developmental or behavioural challenges or at risk of developmental difficulties affected by the war and their families, in July 2022, UNICEF and EASPD signed a partnership agreement to provide Emergency early childhood development action to support this target group of Ukrainian refugees. This regional multi-country initiative is taking place in Moldova, Poland, Slovakia, Romania and Bulgaria and aims to reach 12.000 families via increasing the availability of trained Early Childhood Development Family Consultants who will provide parental counselling and support to young children.
